

HISTORY OF VANCOUVER

Vancouver's history as an urban centre got off to a snappy start in 1867. All that was here on the south shore of Burrard Inlet was the Hastings Sawmill and a couple of tiny native family groupings too small to call settlements. It was so quiet you could shout across the inlet and be heard by someone on the other side. Then, on the last day of September, a ruddy-faced and forevertalking saloon keeper from New Westminster, John Deighton (they called him "Gassy Jack"), came rowing around the heavily forested peninsula that loomed over the entrance to the inlet and aimed his rowboat straight for the mill. With him in the boat was his native wife, her mother and a cousin, a couple of sticks of furniture, an old yellow dog and a barrel of whiskey. The history of this area was about to change forever.

The canny Deighton knew that the workers in the mill had nowhere nearby to get a drink. They either had to walk the many miles through the forest (where they might meet a bear) to New Westminster, or row themselves there around the peninsula on a trip that would take the better part of a day. There was a larger mill on the other side of the inlet, with a tiny settlement around it, but it was run by the stern Sewell Moody, and he allowed no liquor of any kind.

Deighton beached his tiny craft on the shore near the mill and approached the workmen. "Gentlemen," he said, "I intend to build a saloon here. If you'll help me build it, you can have all the whiskey you can drink." The Globe Saloon went up in 24 hours. Some say Vancouver began with the mill, others give the credit to the saloon. Perhaps they should share the credit.

When you walk through Gastown today—the "old town" Vancouver area named for the garrulous Gassy Jack—and stand by his statue, you're very close to where the Globe stood. There's a plaque on the statue's base (which is shaped like a whiskey barrel) that says the local citizens chose the name 'Vancouver.'

Don't you believe it. The name was chosen by the president of the Canadian Pacific Railway, one William Van Horne, a no-nonsense hard-headed man who had pushed the CPR across the country and over the Rockies to reach this point and wanted a name that would indicate where the city was. Its formal name was Granville, for the colonial secretary of the time. "No one will know where that is," Van Horne snorted. "But everyone knows about the Pacific northwest explorations of Captain George Vancouver." And so Vancouver it became.



Incorporation came April 6. 1886 at a modest ceremony in Jonathan Miller's house. A civic election followed guickly, and a month later the first piece of business at the first meeting of Vancouver's first city council, presided over by its first mayor, Malcolm Maclean, was the drafting of a petition to lease from the federal government a 1,000-acre military reserve to be enjoyed by the city as a park. That became Stanley Park. (We still pay a lease of \$1 a year for it.) The tiny city, a ramshackle tumble of stumps, brush and crude wooden buildings was little more than two months old on June 13, 1886 when a swift and furious fire—started when a sudden freak squall blew in sparks from clearing fires to the west—destroyed it in a time recalled as perhaps 20 to 30 minutes. "Vancouver didn't burn," said a contemporary, "It exploded." At least eight people perished, perhaps as many as 20. It was hard to tell, the destruction was so complete. The Great Fire left a pitiful scattering of buildings. One of them, once a general store for the mill's workers and their families, is now a little museum in the western part of the city. It was moved there on a barge in 1930. Rebuilding began within hours after the fire.



The first Canadian Pacific Railway passenger train to arrive in Vancouver, tugged in by the famous little locomotive #374, arrived in May of 1887, adorned with a large photograph of Queen Victoria. (#374, beautifully restored, is on display these days in its own brick-lined room at the eastern end of Davie Street.) When the CPR announced Vancouver would be the railway's terminus, the town's population had been about 400. Four years after the railway arrived, it was 13,000. Many, many more thousands of people would arrive in the city over that same line during the following decades. The first train was followed a month later by the arrival from Japan of the CPR-chartered S.S. Abyssinia with a cargo of tea, silk and mail bound for London. The Abyssinia's arrival marked the beginning of the trans-Pacific, trans-Atlantic trade using the new railway. It left no doubt the little city was going to thrive.


A fine sense of the vitality of the city can be seen in a short film made here in 1907 by a man named William Harbeck. He stuck a camera on the front of a city street car and filmed the city's daily life. It's black-and-white, of course, and silent, and it's fascinating. The streets are alive with people hurrying here and there, horse-drawn buggies clatter by, boys on bicycles zip in front of the camera, ladies with street-length gowns sweep (literally!) along the sidewalks . . . it's the earliest film we know of that shows the city.

The years from 1909 to 1913 were particularly feverish here. One typical newspaper of the day had sixty pages of real estate ads. A tremendous amount of building went on in those years, and many of Vancouver's most well-known structures—some still standing—went up in those few years:

- the Vancouver Block, the stocky white building on Granville just south of Georgia Street, topped by a big illuminated clock.
- The Rogers Building, a handsome white terra cotta building at Granville and Pender, named for its developer, Jonathan Rogers (who happened to be the first passenger to step down from the first train)
- The "Old Sun Tower," the funky green-towered building on Pender Street that began life as the World Building, named for a now-defunct daily newspaper (magician and escape artist Harry Houdini once hung upside down from this building enclosed in a strait jacket . . . and, of course, escaped)
- The Dominion Building, another funky relic of those years, an oddly shaped red-and-orange skyscraper at the northwest corner of Hastings and Cambie.

A walk around downtown is rewarded by seeing these and other famous city buildings. The third and present Hotel Vancouver is a perfect example. Built in the famous chateau style by the CPR the hotel has been a landmark in the city since 1939, two of its first guests being King George VI and Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother.

Speaking of notable buildings, Vancouver's Chinatown is rich with them. The combination of their narrow, multi-colored facades (which, oddly, owe as much to Portuguese architecture as Chinese, a fact too detailed to describe here), ornate balconies and colorful Chinese signage makes a visit to Canada's largest Chinatown an essential part of a visit to the city. Even the street signs are bilingual. Music from China sounds out from open shop doors—when weather permits. There are lots of



restaurants here, too, and if you like Dim Sum, you'll love it here. The Chinese have been a part of the city's history since the very beginning (thousands of them helped to build the CPR)—but it must be said that relations between the races haven't always been smooth. Our earlier history is heavily sprinkled with examples of intolerance and discrimination. It's much calmer these days, and one Vancouver suburb, Richmond, is more than a third Chinese.

Other ethnic groups add to the color of the city: there is an important East Indian neighborhood on south Main Street with street signs in English and Punjabi. Big numbers of Vietnamese, German, Greek, Scandinavian and other nationalities make this perhaps the most cosmopolitan city in North America.

Native people, too, have shared the city's history. The first road around the Stanley Park peninsula was paved by the European settlers with shells discarded, after their contents were consumed, in vast native middens.

In 1929, just before the Great Depression, two municipalities adjacent to Vancouver - South Vancouver and Point Grey - amalgamated with us to create Canada's third largest metropolitan area. It still is. In 2015, the total population of Greater Vancouver – the city itself and 24 other members of Metro Vancouver–topped 2,504,305 residents.

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Point Grey, still called that, is home to the University of British Columbia, founded in 1915 and situated on a sprawling 402 hectares. UBC had (in 2015) 42,986 students and 9,735 graduate students. Of the total student body, 12,117 were international students representing 155 different countries. There are other important universities and colleges here, too, chief among them Simon Fraser University in Vancouver's neighboring city, Burnaby. We joined the rest of the world by air in 1931 with the opening of our first real airport. We'd been embarrassed into building it when famed aviator Charles Lindbergh, touring the continent after his famous solo flight across the Atlantic, said he wouldn't add Vancouver to his itinerary because "your airport isn't fit to land on!" Today. Vancouver International Airport is one of the most modern on the continent, and looks to handle more than 20 million




passengers this year. That number has continued to rise in volume since the city hosted the Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games in 2010.

One striking object at today's airport is a sculpture called Haida Gwaii, by the late Bill Reid. His mother was of the Haida people, and his work reflects that heritage. Haida Gwaii is a particularly dramatic example of Reid's skill, a huge larger-than-life representation of a canoe filled with mythical creatures: Eagle, the Raven, Bear Mother, Mouse Woman and Dogfish Woman. It's an exact copy (in jade green) of a black version in front of the Canadian Embassy in Washington, DC. That embassy, by the way, was designed by Canada's most well-known architect: Arthur Erickson of Vancouver. Erickson's dramatic work, including

Simon Fraser University and the courthouse complex in downtown Vancouver, are famous around the world.

When you visit you will see why "Travel & Leisure Magazine" just recently named Stanley Park the second most beautiful park in the world after Park Guell, in Barcelona, Spain.

"The temperate rainforest of Stanley Park is almost completely surrounded by water, with both gorgeous skyline views and wild forest of 500,000 cedar, fir, and hemlock trees. It connects to the historic waterfront and downtown via a 5.5-mile portion of seawall that surrounds the park, popular with joggers, strollers, and cyclists. Rose and rhododendron gardens, nine intricately carved First Nations totem poles, a small golf course, an outdoor summer theater, a seaside swimming pool, and areas for lawn bowling round out its charms." — *Travel & Leisure Magazine*

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A Green Jewel in an Urban Setting: Stanley Park's History

Stanley Park has been Vancouver's favourite urban playground for as long as the city itself has been in existence. When members of city council convened for their second meeting on May 12, 1886, just five weeks after the city was incorporated, high on the agenda was the matter of a civic park. Council drafted a petition asking the government of Canada to hand over the 1,000-acre military reserve located on the peninsula of land jutting into Burrard Inlet at the "First Narrows". The federal government complied, and in October, 1888, Governor-General Lord Stanley came to town to dedicate the park. In the rest of the country, Stanley is best known for donating the silverware that became the National Hockey League's championship trophy. Here in Vancouver, he is known for the park that bears his name.

The city's founders prided themselves on their farsightedness. Urban parks were, and still are, considered the hallmark of a progressive community. But more than community spirit motivated these pioneer politicians, who were mainly merchants and land speculators. By forestalling the possibility that the military reserve might ever be sold off as real estate, they were protecting the value of their own property investments elsewhere in the city.

No one had consulted the park's original inhabitants, the First Nations people who had used the peninsula for generations before the arrival of outsiders. The Squamish people had occupied seasonal camps at Whoi Whoi (Lumberman's Arch), Staitwouk (Second Beach), and Chaythoos (Prospect Point) and were still living there when the park was created. There were several fishermen and millhands living with their families near Brockton Point on land they were never allowed to acquire, and a group of "Kanakas" (Hawaiians) living in Coal Harbour. All of these people were eventually displaced by the government in order to create a pristine wilderness for the residents of the city to enjoy.

Of course, there was nothing pristine about the park. Loggers had been busy since the 1860s hacking down the original tree cover, and the first thing the city did after taking control was to carve out a scenic road around the perimeter of the peninsula. There is still a First Nations presence in the park. A cluster of totem poles near Brockton Point serves to remind visitors of the first inhabitants.



The original park reserve was an island, cut off at high tide by the rising waters of Coal Harbour and English Bay as they merged in the low area now occupied by Lost Lagoon. The water was crossed by a log bridge until the stone causeway was built in 1916, creating the small lake. The name Lost Lagoon comes from a Pauline Johnson poem:



It is dusk on the Lost Lagoon and we two dreaming the dusk away, beneath the drift of a twilight grey, beneath the drowse of an ending day, and the curve of a golden moon.

The ashes of the famous poet, who lived out her final years in Vancouver, are buried beneath a cairn near Third Beach. Between the world wars, the biggest change to the park was the construction of the main road linking the Georgia Street entrance with Lions Gate Bridge. A group of British investors built the bridge to provide access to their North Shore real estate development, the British Properties. It opened in November 1938, by which time work crews had completed the road, known subsequently as The Causeway. It had been approved by voters in a public plebiscite and carried out largely as a Depression-era make-work project. For many years this thoroughfare featured one lane of traffic in each direction and a middle lane, known aptly as the "suicide lane" because it was open to traffic for passing in either direction. Nowadays, traffic is controlled by signal lights.

Stanley Park has been described as "half savage, half domestic" and it tries its best to be both. Strolling along a forest trail, visitors can imagine they are walking through a coastal rainforest far from civilization. Yet just around the corner they

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might bump into a busload of tourists, a spandex-clad jogger or a putting green, reminding them the park is a playground used by eight million visitors every year.

Brockton Oval is an actual playground. Once the city's leading sports facility, it played host to track meets and touring rugby teams. The beautifully groomed cricket pitch is still in use, weather permitting, the players' white uniforms sparkling in the sun under the drowsy gaze of lounging onlookers. Brockton Point is also the site of the Nine O'Clock gun which has been booming out across the harbour at nine o'clock each evening since it was installed in 1894. In all that time it has only fallen silent twice; during the Second World War and again in 1969 when engineering students from the university stole it as a prank.

One of the most popular of the park's tenants is the Vancouver Aquarium, which opened its doors in 1956, the first public aquarium in Canada. Another popular feature of the park today is probably the Seawall Walk which rings the perimeter. Begun in 1912 to protect the shores of the park from tidal erosion, it took more than 60 years to complete. Stanley Park remains the city's number one destination for locals and tourists alike with over 8 million visitors enjoying the park each year.





Attractions & What to See

Stanley Park

The crown iewel of Vancouver's nearly 200 city parks, Stanley Park is a 400-hectare (1.000-acre) evergreen oasis connected to the city's West End by a narrow strip of land. An 8.8-kilometre (5.5-mile) seawall surrounds the park's perimeter offering breathtaking views at every turn and making it a hotspot for cyclists, runners, walkers and rollerbladers. Recently named the world's best city park by TripAdvisor, Stanley Park is home to wildlife. beaches, the Vancouver Aguarium, a pitch & putt, water park and miniature railway. Other landmarks

worth visiting include the Stanley Park Rose Garden, Prospect Point Lookout, the 9 O'Clock Gun, Siwash Rock, Lost Lagoon, the nine totem poles at Brockton Point and the Stanley Park Hollow Tree, a 700 to 800-year-old western red cedar tree stump. Designated a National Historic Site of Canada, Stanley Park is deserving of an itinerary unto itself.

Prospect Point Lookout in Stanley Park

Vancouver's #1 Attraction (4 million visitors) – boasting spectacular views of the Northshore Mountains. Lions Gate Bridge and Burrard Inlet, the historic Prospect Point Lookout has been a "Vancouver Tradition" since the early 1800's. National Geographic Tree

This is a huge red cedar, almost 30 metres around, that the National Geographic Society believes is the largest of its kind in the world. It's rooted near Stanley Park's Hollow Tree (a much better known tree locally), 30 metres along the trail to Third Beach.

Birds in the Park

Stanley Park is a breeding ground for birds, ducks, geese and swans; a great place for bird watching. Stroll around Lost Lagoon and you'll spot a blue heron or a wood duck. Beaver Lake, nestled inside Stanley Park is a quiet sanctuary for birds and people alike. In spring, ducklings can be seen trailing mama around in the water and across the paths. The city provides seed to the birds and in winter is a virtual plethora of fowl.





Vancouver Aquarium

Dolphins, stingrays, sea turtles, otters and jellyfish – oh my! Canada's largest aquarium, with its biggest-ever expansion now open, teaches the importance of aquatic-life conservation through interpretive galleries and underwater exhibits. The West End - English Bay

The West End of Vancouver boasts three of the City's most vibrant and popular commercial streets -Davie, Denman and Robson Streets. The West End is the area of the downtown peninsula west of Burrard Street and South of Georgia Street surrounded on three sides by water, seawalls and park space. What makes the West End so amazing is its famous residential density and its proximity to English Bay, Stanley Park and Downtown Vancouver.



Granville - Theatre Row & Entertainment District

This short stretch along Granville Street between Davie and Smithe contains an eclectic array of trendy counter-culture stores selling comic books, retro-70s clothing and ironic style statements for a predominantly under-30s crowd. The area is undergoing a revitalization, and now features numerous pubs. clubs, and of course at Robson, includes the opening of Nordstrom's. 230,000 square feet of retail shopping bliss.





Robson Street

This unique street was named after John Robson, Premier of British Columbia from 1889 - 1892. Its commercial traditions date from 1895 when train tracks were laid along it, and a wide variety of small shops sprang up to serve Vancouver's rapidly growing population.

In the post World War II era, Robson Street evolved into a reflection of the European shopkeepers who operated the many small delicatessens, patisseries, and chic boutiques that populated the street. Today, the character of Robson Street has continued to evolve. With an eclectic mix of shops and restaurants, discover many fine dining, premier fashion stores and services. Come to where the world shops.



Gastown

The Gastown area of Vancouver, in the downtown core, was named for a talkative Yorkshire-born saloon owner. John Deighton. nicknamed Gassy Jack. Gassy Jack showed up with a barrel of whisky on the south shore of Burrard Inlet and told the area's mill workers they could have all the whisky they could drink if they helped him build his saloon. This was even more incentive than usual, because the nearest drinking spot was then a day's walk away through the bush to New Westminster. The men built Gassy's saloon in 24 hours. It was located on Water Street in the downtown core.



Chinatown

Chinatown in Vancouver. British Columbia is Canada's largest Chinatown. Centred on Pender Street, it is surrounded by Gastown and the Downtown Financial and Central Business Districts to the west, the Downtown Eastside to the north, the remnant of old Japantown to the northeast, and the residential neighbourhood of Strathcona to the east

Chinatown was once known for its neon signs but like the rest of the city lost many of the spectacular signs to changing times and a new sign by law passed in 1974. The last of these was the Ho Ho sign (which showed a rice bowl and chop sticks) which was removed in 1997. Ongoing efforts at revitalization include efforts by the business community to improve safety by hiring



private security, looking at new marketing promotions and introducing residential units into the neighbourhood by restoring and renovating some of the heritage buildings. Current focus is on the restoration and adaptive reuse of the distinctive Association buildings, It's the best place in Vancouver to buy freshly-prepared Asian delicacies from moon cake to roasted duck. The summer weekend night market is always popular, especially for cheap imported goods and a vast smorgasbord of take-out food options.

2018 saw the Vancouver Chinatown Merchant Association cancel its Historic Chinatown open air night market to protest the city's property development policies in Chinatown. Let's hope things are resolved for 2019 when the streets will once again be closed to traffic, transforming the

street scape into a psychedelic neon-lit scene. With vendors selling everything from dried seafood to exotic fruits and vegetables to life-sized stuffed animals, the Chinatown Night Market will again become a must see event in Vancouver.

As the first authentic classical Chinese garden ever built outside of China, it is a feast for the senses and the mind and is acclaimed for providing peace, tranquility and a harmonious delight for the nature lover, cultural tourist, and sight-seeing visitor. Yaletown & False Creek

Yaletown is the envy of city planners around the world who would love to emulate the area's transformation from crumbling industrial district to postmodern trendsetter. But the Yaletown of today-widely regarded as Vancouver's 'Little Soho' —is a far cry from the area's gritty roots in the 1880's, when the Canadian Pacific Railway housed its rail yards here and manufacturers built warehouses to take advantage of easy access to the network

Thriving as the city's industrial heart for decades, Yaletown suffered badly in the 1940's, when highways replaced rail as the preferred method for transporting goods. By the 1970's, the area's few remaining businesses were outnumbered by rough bars and derelict storage space. Many of Yaletown's former industrial

brick warehouses have been converted into super-hip clothing stores, designer furniture outlets and even a trendy showroom for the new Mini Cooper-a post-modern reinvention of a design classic that mirrors the stylish redevelopment of the Yaletown area.

GET OUTSIDE

Fishing

The wilderness of this region offers some of the most spectacular settings for fly-fishing and spin fishing. From remote alpine lakes to crystal-clear mountain rivers, the Pemberton area has plenty of opportunities to hook impressive trout. salmon and steelhead. Lillooet is known for big. healthy and abundant fish especially the mighty white sturgeon. For another fishing experience, there are several trout-stocked urban lakes in Metro Vancouver. In spring or fall, visit Lafarge Lake in Coquitlam or Sasamat Lake in Port Moody - both are stocked with rainbow trout. Or you can fish for white

sturgeon in the Fraser River near Chilliwack and Mission. but bring your biceps because this protected species is the largest freshwater fish in North America and can weigh up to 454 kilograms (1.000 pounds). And along the Sunshine Coast, saltwater anglers should expect great peak-season salmon fishing. Or you can head to the Strait of Georgia. which is a major salmon migration route, accessible from several communities. The deep waters of Pender Harbour will also produce salmon, but what they're really famous for is their giant lingcod.

Whale Watching

For a truly exhilarating excursion, whale watching with a local tour provider can't be beat! Getting close enough to these maiestic creatures often starts in the historic fishing village of Steveston (in Richmond) or from downtown Vancouver. Within minutes of either point of departure, vou'll find yourself exploring the Strait of Georgia, Fraser River Delta and Gulf Islands. home to these mighty mammals. You'll also get a chance to spot harbour seals, sea lions, porpoises and a variety of marine wildlife that call these coastal. waters home - don't miss out on this once-in-a-lifetime experience!





Cycling

The Metro Vancouver area is also well known for its great cycling opportunities. Right in the heart of Vancouver, the Seawall is a scenic 22-kilometre (13.7-mile) path that wraps around the city's waterfront and Stanley Park. The trail is divided into two clearly marked sections - one for walkers and joggers, and one for cyclists and inline skaters. Richmond is also a great spot for cycling as a result of a system of dykes topped with 80 kilometres (50 miles) of flat, easily-accessible. interconnected trails that meander past heritage sites, parks, wildlife areas and spectacular scenery.

Horseback Riding

Whether you're looking for western or English riding options, there are a host of stables and ranches that will get you saddled up and on your way. Most outfitters in the region offer day trips that will take you through a range of scenery and terrain including secluded forest trails, along the edges of rivers, up majestic mountains and across grassy meadows. With around 7.000 horses. Langley is the epicentre for riding, and has become known as the "Horse Capital of BC."

Campbell Valley Regional Park, in particular, is a magnet for equestrian fans.

Kavaking

Kayaking is a prominent water activity that can be found in every part of the region. Paddle across idyllic lakes, discover untouched coastlines, explore secret islands or float through tranquil coves. Popular ocean kayaking destinations include Bowen Island, Deep Cove in North Vancouver and the Sunshine Coast.



And it's no wonder with a 260-hectare (1,322-acre) park that is completely loaded with horseback riding trails and cross-country equestrian jumps. With so much focus on horseback riding in Langley there are several outfitters to choose from - all of which are qualified to guide you on a trail ride through some of the area's beautiful parks and countryside.

Watch for whales, sea lions and bald eagles, and keep an eye out for colourful starfish on the ocean floor. vancouverwateradventures.com, or harrisonecotours.com or deepcovekayak.com



Sailing & Power Boating

While sailing or power boating, the opportunities to explore serene coastal fjords, pristine marine parks, and hundreds of islands, bays and coves are nearly limitless. Desolation Sound Marine Provincial Park on the Sunshine Coast is a boater's paradise, and has more than 60 kilometres (37 miles) of almost untouched shoreline. Princess Louisa Inlet is a magnificent granite gorge, which rises sharply from the water's edge to heights in excess of 2,100 metres (7,000 feet) and a depth of 300 metres (1.000 feet). Visitors from all over the world come to see this

almost completely enclosed, magical fjord. Warm sun melting the mountain top snow creates more than 60 phenomenal waterfalls that cascade down its precipitous granite walls and mingle with the waters below. Beautiful. Chatterbox Falls, located at the head of the Inlet, tumbles 40 metres (120 feet) making it a sight to behold. This spectacular park is only accessible by boat or floatplane, giving it the feeling of a secret hideaway. Another trip boaters might enjoy is sailing up Indian Arm, an 18-kilometre (11-mile) fiord that extends north from Burrard Inlet in Vancouver.



Golfing

From spectacular mountain scenery along the Sea to Sky corridor to the championship level courses of Metro Vancouver, there's no shortage of appealing options for the golfer inside. With over 600 parks and green spaces, Surrey is home to some of the best golf courses that attract golfers from across Canada and the globe. Challenging, award-winning layouts, with stunning mountain and water views give players an experience they won't soon forget. You'll also discover



four golf courses near Whistler and Pemberton with outstanding scenic mountain backdrops. And since the region's mild climate enables many courses to stay open all year long, the area is nothing short of a golfer's paradise.

Mountain Biking

Heralded as the birthplace of freeriding, Vancouver's famed North Shore Mountains are an internationally regarded destination.

Mount Fromme, Mount Seymour and Cypress

Mountain have routes that are so steep it's hard to

believe someone could actually maneuver them.

Further north, Squamish is renowned for its excellent cross-country, downhill and freeriding opportunities, and has a trail for every experience level.





Stand Up Paddleboarding

Stand up paddleboarding is a fairly new water activity that has been steadily increasing in popularity worldwide. If you're looking to try it out, Gibsons is a great place to start. Rent a stand up paddleboard near the dock in Gibsons Harbour and then spend

some time exploring the surrounding waters. Be on the lookout for marine life as you paddle. You'll probably spot some fish and maybe even a few bright purple sea stars in the shallow waters. Or try North Vancouver, where a stand up paddleboard ride will have you floating across the tranquil ocean waters of Deep Cove. If you're a seasoned paddleboarder, grab a rental and hit the water. or if it's your first time, consider taking a class to learn the basics in one of the most beautiful outdoor classrooms in the region.

through the air with the beauty of nature all around you. The dual-line, five-line circuit at Grouse Mountain offers an adrenaline-pumping tour across the peaks and canyons of Grouse and Dam Mountains. Don't blink because you'll be travelling at speeds of up to 80 kilometres/hour (50 miles/hour) and you don't want to miss the amazing views!

Whitewater Rafting

There are few places in the world where so many rafting rivers are so close to a major city. Choose from single or multi-day trips, with both motorpowered and paddle-powered rafting available. Perhaps the best place to begin your adventure is in Lytton, since its location at the confluence of the Thompson and Fraser Rivers has earned it the reputation of being the "rafting capital of Canada."



Or you could check out the nearby Nahatlatch, Coquihalla and Stein Rivers as well. There's also the Chilliwack River, which drops 10 metres/kilometre (52.8 feet/mile), creating numerous long and continuous rapids.


Mountain Climbing

Squamish, another climber's paradise, is recognized as one of the world's top rock climbing destinations, largely due to the incredibly sticky granite found all over town including the Stawamus Chief. At present, there are over 3.500 routes and boulder problems in the Squamish area. Your first stop should be the Squamish Adventure Centre where you can discover all the access points, and decide whether or not you want a personal guide (or even a lesson).

Grouse Mountain, Cypress Mountain and Mount Seymour on Vancouver's North Shore all offer fantastic skiing and snowboarding opportunities





Grouse Grind

The Grouse Grind in North Vancouver is a very challenging 2.9-kilometre (1.8mile) trail up the face of Grouse Mountain.



Commonly referred to as "Mother Nature's Stairmaster." this one is a workout. With an elevation gain of 853 metres (2,800 feet), you'll be climbing 2,830 steps up a mountain, so you'll need strong hips and legs. There are rest stops and a few benches at the halfway mark for hikers to take a breather. but they are limited. Until you emerge at the very top there are few viewpoints through the forest, but once you see it for yourself, the panoramic view of Vancouver below will make the tough climb worthwhile. Over 100,000 people hike the trail annually.
